Day 1

We meet in Whitefish, gateway to the craggy peaks, turquoise alpine lakes, and glacier-carved valleys of Glacier National Park. Your discovery of "Glacier Country" commences with a beautiful wildflower-filled hike up the Danny On Memorial Hiking Trail at Whitefish Mountain Resort.

Day 2

Today we'll hike one of the park's most popular trails, starting on the Trail of the Cedars. It takes us through a stunning gorge and old-growth forest then climbs upward and rewards us with the eye-popping beauty of Avalanche Lake, surrounded by steep walls chock full of waterfalls! This afternoon, we'll share an exciting raft trip down the Middle Fork of the Flathead, a wild and scenic River that helps form the southwestern border of the park.

Day 3

The drive to today's trailhead may be almost as incredible as the hike itself! We take the famous Going-to-the-Sun Road all the way up to Logan Pass, the highest point of the road, at 6,646 feet. From there we embark on a hike on the Highline Trail, known as the most scenic hike in America. With every step, there is a "Wow!"

Day 4

Today, we shuttle to the Many Glacier area, known as the "Switzerland of North America." We'll take a boat ride across Swiftcurrent Lake, where you'll then have your choice of a multitude of routes in the Grinnell Glacier Complex, another ultra-scenic area of the park, and a place where you can see an actual glacier.

Day 5

On our final day, you'll enjoy a beautiful early morning hike to a waterfall before making the two-hour shuttle back to the Whitefish area and saying our goodbyes.
